Skills deficit contributes to large-scale youth unemployment and underemployment which is undermining societies and threatening the stability of countries whose youth population is still increasing rapidly. Achieving the transition towards the development model outlined by the SDG agenda will require, among other things, a major effort to equip the population with a broad range of skills including vocational, transferable 21st-century skills, digital, entrepreneurial and global citizenship skills is required.

The Session will open the conference by reflecting on the role of skills in the sustainable development agenda; it offers an opportunity to engage with the challenges underpinning youth unemployment and identify viable solutions to boost youth employment.
